



# The Georgia National Fair Draft Horse Show

**Is very Excited to Announce**



**Attention - All Youth Draft Horse Exhibitors!**

**Georgia National Fair, Perry, GA - October 14-15, 2016**

This will be a Hi-Point type competition for all Youth Exhibitors. There is no enrollment required for this award. Every Youth that competes (with any horse/team) in any combination of the following five classes is eligible and will be automatically entered: (youth exhibitors may not show a Stallion in any class)

**Youth Showmanship (in either age category) - Youth Under Saddle English  
Youth Under Saddle Western - Youth Cart - Youth Team**

The Points will be counted as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> – 10 Points, 2<sup>nd</sup> – 9 Points, 3<sup>rd</sup> – 8 Points, 4<sup>th</sup> – 7 Points, 5<sup>th</sup> – 6 Points, 6<sup>th</sup> – 5 Points, 7<sup>th</sup> – 4 Points, 8<sup>th</sup> – 3 Points, 9<sup>th</sup> – 2 Points, 10<sup>th</sup> – 1 Point, all remaining exhibitors 1 point each. In the event of a tie for any of the places – the youth with the greatest number of 1<sup>st</sup> places will be the winner. If a tie remains, it will go to the youth with the greatest number of 2<sup>nd</sup> places, and so on.

All Youth exhibitors will be called to the Show Ring Saturday Night when the results have been tallied after all the youth classes have completed. There, a Memorial for Pia will be read out by our announcer, the results will be announced and the awards will be presented to the winners and all youth exhibitors.

There will be Five Places Awarded: **1<sup>st</sup> Place - \$350.00, Trophy, & GNF Medal**  
**2<sup>nd</sup> Place - \$250.00 & GNF Medal**  
**3<sup>rd</sup> Place - \$150.00 & GNF Medal**  
**4<sup>th</sup> Place - \$100.00 & GNF Medal**  
**5<sup>th</sup> Place - \$50.00 & GNF Medal**

**with a GNF Medal given out to every remaining youth exhibitor.**
